

Lady 'Dogs Place at Quinter

The girls track team from Golden Plains High School placed sixth out of 13 teams in the competitive Quinter Invitational on May 2.

The girls continue to improve in their events as they consistently place in multiple events. Maggi Nieman has decreased her time in the distance races throughout the year. She finished second in the 3200m run with her best time of 13:57.19 and third in the 1600m run with a time of 6:18.92.

KayCee Miller is a continual point scorer in multiple events. She placed fourth in the 100m (13.44), fourth in the 200m (28.47), and sixth in long jump (14' 6"). Kami Miller also placed third in 100m hurdles (16.94), sixth in 300m hurdles (53.12), and fifth in long jump (14' 7"). Both girls are members of the second place 4 x 100m relay team along with Kynndra Rush and Gabrielle Schiltz with a time of 54.97.

Schiltz placed third in triple jump with a jump of 31' 0" and jumped 14' 2" to finish in the top half of long jumpers. She also ran 30.67 in 200m to finish in the top half of competitors. Rush just missed scoring as she finished 8th out of 16 girls in the 800m run with a time of 2:50.90 and threw the javelin 77' 6".

Noel Ritter improved in several events including decreased speeds in 200m (34.02) and 400m (1:19.73). Haley Miller also decreased her time in the 400m to 1:19.71. Miller ran the 4 x 400m relay with Morgan Ritter, Jennifer Esparza, and Brianna Stoll for an improved time of 5:21.98 and fifth place.

Stoll ran the 100m in 15.23 seconds, while Morgan Ritter also threw the shot put 26' 9.75", the discus 74' 3", and the javelin 58' 5". Jennifer Esparza ran the 400m in 1:22.18, threw the shot put 29' 6.25" for sixth place, and tossed the discus 63' 4". Following this rescheduled meet, the girls competed again on Tuesday, May 3, in Logan.
