Bulldogs Finish Season at Sub-State By Judy Rogers

The Golden Plains Bulldogs finished their volleyball season with a close match against Northern Valley at Sub-State in Rexford on October 24.

The Bulldogs entered the sub-state tournament with a 21-12 record ranked #3 in the Sub-State. They, Logan, and Northern Valley were all ranked in the top ten in Class 1A Division II state rankings according to the Kansas Volleyball Association, so they knew it would be a tournament filled with excellent volleyball action.

The Bulldogs advanced to the semi-final round to face the Northern Valley Huskies who had had a bye for the first round. "We knew we had nothing to lose," added Walz. "We left it all on the court." The Huskies advanced to play top-seeded Logan Trojans in the championship game. Logan won in three sets to qualify for the state tournament this week.
