Players Receive Post-Season Honors By Judy Rogers

Golden Plains had three athletes named to the Western Kansas Liberty League All-League Basketball Team. Senior Gabrielle Schiltz and Sophomore KayCee Miller were named first team while senior Brett Gerbitz was named Honorable Mention.

Gabrielle Schiltz was a four-year member of the Bulldog squad. She played in the state tournament three of her four years of high school. As a senior, she scored a total of 302 points including a 63% free throw percentage. She was a leader on both sides of the ball with 123 rebounds, 41 assists, and 32 steals this season. Schiltz was also named to the Topeka Capital All-State Second Team, Sports in Kansas Class IA Division II all-class second team and will play in the Northwest Kansas All-Star game. "I would like to thank Coach Christensen and Coach Shaw for everything have done for me and our team the past four years," said Schiltz. "They have helped me develop as a player and grow as a person. KayCee Miller has been a starter for the Bulldogs the past two seasons. She led the Bulldogs with 351 points with a 66% free throw percentage. In addition to all-league, she was named to the Topeka Capital All-State First Team and Sports in Kansas First Team for Class 1A Division II. Brett Gerbitz has played for the Bulldogs the past three years. Brett was a leading scorer for the Bulldogs with 186 total points with many of his points coming from behind the arc. "This has been one of my goals," said Gerbitz. "There are a lot of good athletes in the league so I was honored and happy to be included."

Also receiving recognition for his efforts on the basketball team was senior Dawson Spresser who will be playing in the Northwest Kansas All-Star Game in Colby on April 9. Spresser, a four year Bulldog player, was another floor leader with a total of 124 points this season. He averaged 1.8 rebounds per game with a 57% free throw percentage.
