

Lady Bulldogs Win Logan Invitational By Judy Rogers

The Lady Bulldogs from Golden Plains won the Logan Invitational Track Meet on May 6 in Logan. “Our athletes always seem to perform well in Logan,” said Coach Travis Smith, “and this meet was no exception.”

The Lady Bulldogs had at least one girl place in each track event they entered, while others added points from the field. Many posted improved times and distances in their events. In the 100m dash, Kynndra Rush finished 2nd with a time of 14.02. Also running the 100m were Brianna Stoll (15.12) and Jessica Koerperich (15.74)

Two Lady Bulldogs placed in the 200m dash—Macayla Easton 2nd (29.06) and Kylie Jones 6th (30.75). Stoll was close behind just missing points in 8th place (31.54). In the 400m run Easton won first place (1:04.88), Gabrielle Schiltz placed 5th (1:10.20), and Koerperich was 8th (1:18.31). Rush won the 800m with a time of 2:35.59—her best this season. Ana Bermudez posted her season best times in the 1600m (4th-6:31.91) and in the 3200m (2nd 14:12.49) runs.

Kami Miller placed 2nd in the 100m hurdles (16.74) and 3rd in the 300m hurdles (52.65). She also ran on the 4 x 100 relay team with Easton, Rush, and Jones for a second place finish (55.36) and finished first in the 4 x 400m relay with Easton, Schiltz, and Jones (4:32.79). The 4 x 800m relay also placed second with Rebecca Bange, Morgan Ritter, Brianna Stoll, and Rachael Ritter running the laps in 13:41.43.

Morgan Ritter improved her throw in the shot put to 26’ 10” along with Arianna Camacho extending her distance to 23’ 3.5”. Rachael Ritter threw 25’ 9”. The same three girls also threw discus—R. Ritter 67’ 5”, M. Ritter 65’ 7”, Camacho 56’ 1”. In javelin, Camacho threw a season best 66’ 3” along with M. Ritter 56’ 2” and R. Ritter 50’ 9”.

Kylie Jones placed 4th in high jump at 4’ 10” and Gabrielle Schiltz placed 3rd in triple jump at 31’ 6.5”. Schiltz jumped 12’ 9.75” in long jump along with Koerperich 11’ 8.25”. Rebecca Bange rounded out the events by jumping 24’ 10.75” in triple jump just missing scoring in 7th place.

The Lady Bulldogs will take their win to the Colby Invitational on Friday to continue to improve their skills in preparation for the upcoming league and regional meets.
